Hadley Park Road

Pedestrian Crossings

T&W Highways have planned the delivery of two raised pedestrian crossings on Hadley Park Road, after the issues of speeding were raised by the Borough Ward Members Cllr Eileen Callear and Cllr Amrik Jhawar. The work is currently planned to begin in March/April 2025 and will include raised bed crossings near to the Gurdwara and just along from the Cemetery. Raised pedestrian crossings are used as traffic calming measures and allow pedestrians to cross the road at the same level as the footpath. They are designed to slow down approaching vehicles.

Experimental Closure

Following both online and in-person consultations with residents of Etruria Village, T&W Highways are looking to implement an Experimental closure at the junction of Church Street - which will see the end of through traffic on the estate for around 12-18 months. Residents opted for this measure, as it will allow them to see what impact a closure would deliver for them, before considering anything more permanent. Further consultation will be carried out during the experimental order.

The council expressed strong support for this initiative, and it is anticipated that the Youth Club will commence operations in the near future.

Cllr Eileen Callear, Chair of the Council, commented: "Hadley & Leegomery Parish Council is dedicated to delivering services that significantly impact the young people in our parish. The new Youth Club in Hadley will provide a safe, welcoming space for youngsters to meet, socialise, and acquire new skills, such as cooking. We will keep the community updated as soon as we have a confirmed start date."



Allotments - Growing Together

Leegomery Allotment Gardens, situated just off Millstream Way, has almost a hundred plots – they are rented out to plot holders on an annual basis.

My experience of being an allotment holder over the last three years has been very positive: it is hugely satisfying watching the things I have planted grow and then being able to harvest and eat them as well as to be able to give produce to friends and family. (It is frustrating when things get eaten by slugs...but that's just part of gardening). I have made some good friends at the allotments, too – there is always something relevant to talk about.

The allotment association is run by a committee made up of plot holders – the committee meets regularly to discuss the running of and issues concerning the allotments.

What is the CAT Team?

Hadley & Leegomery Parish Council have a Community Action Team, which is often referred to as the CAT team.

The Community Action Team is done via a partnership working agreement with Telford & Wrekin Council which includes a public Realm Team (Gordon & Bogden) who carry out all kinds of work, from trimming hedges to tending to the cemetery, helping to keep the parish tidy, an Environmental Liaison Officer (2.5days a week) who surveys the area, picking up any issues and getting them resolved quickly, and an Enforcement Team who carry out work around anti-social behaviour, parking issues and flytipping/littering. The parish recieves a contribution towards this from T&W Council, which gives an enhanced level of services on top of the core contract.



Budget 2025/2026

At the full council meeting on Tuesday, the 7th of January the parish council approved the new budget for the year 25/26. We all know that our community benefits because of the services and amenities we cherish. Unfortunately, the rising cost of goods and services has put immense pressure on ours, and every other councils budgets, and indeed on residents too.

Cllr Jordan Keeble - Chair of Finance & General Purposes Committee highlighted some of the increases during the debate. He said: Costs such as Street-lighting have risen from £33,769 in 2019/20 to £46,169 in 2023/24 (up 36.7%), and predicted to cost £67,000 in the coming year - an increase of 98.4%. Hadley Community Centre utilities have risen from £8024 in 2019/2020 to £13,259 in 2023/24 (up 65.2%) and are predicted to cost £25,000 in 2024/25, a whopping 211.6% rise. Insurance is predicted to rise by 56.3%, Elections up by 135.4% in 2023/24 and another 38.9% in the coming year.

To continue supporting local democracy and vital services, such as our CAT Team—who help to keep the parish tidy, street lighting, community events and the upkeep of our beloved community centre, and importantly the securing of the Leegomery Community Centre we had to consider raising the parish precept. Understanding the basics of how Local councils work is important. Money comes in from the parish precept, which forms part of the Council Tax. This provides revenue to run the parish services mentioned previously.

The Parish Council has a legal responsibility to return a balanced budget. The budget outlines what money is to be spent on. We cannot 'overspend' on our budget. Our community centres are more than just buildings; they are the heart of our parish. They serve as a gathering place for young and old alike, hosting events, classes, and activities that enrich our lives. Without adequate funding, we risk losing these invaluable resources. By increasing the precept, we can ensure that services are protected, the community centres remain open and continue to serve as a beacon of connection and support.

While the council understands that no one likes to see their bills go up, this modest increase of around 45p per week for a band D property, will make a significant difference. It will help us preserve the amenities and services that make our parish a wonderful place to live. We are now in a position to secure more grant funding and make improvements that will save money and hopefully to come in at the end of the year under budget. Plus we have to look at bolstering council reserves - which were depleted by renovation of the cemetery lodge, vital support during covid and the cost of living crisis.

The Parish Councils disappointment on the outcome on the GKN Planning Application

Your Parish Council on a number of occasions, unanimously opposed the Planning Application to develop the GKN site (0673) due to the effect it will have on residents, and the wider area.

We were disappointed that the application was passed by the Planning Committee at Telford & Wrekin Council by 2 votes, with 1 against and 7 abstentions to allow the development to go ahead.

Your council along with residents continue to work together to meet with the Planners, Applicants, Constructors, End Users, in Liaison meetings to do all we can to monitor, challenge and hold to account any hazards, pollutions, that effect our residents.



New Bleed Kit

Hadley & Leegomery Parish Council have installed a new publically accessible bleed kit outside Hadley Community Centre. There are many ways for a catastrophic bleed to occur, such as from a car accident or a work related injury. We believe that having a publicly accessible bleeding control pack is vital to provide the necessary first aid to reduce blood loss until professional medical help arrives. We hope we never need to use the kit, but if it is ever needed, it could mean the difference between life and death.



Hurleybrook Path

Work to clean and repair the Hurley Brook path was completed with Cllr Pride Funding from Cllr Callear, Cllr Jhawar and Cllr Kaur. The area has seen a number of improvements with artwork to the bridge, work to the path and all of the amazing work done by The Friends of The Hurley Brook Group. More work to come!

Update from your Hadley & Leegomery Borough Councillors...

Hadley & Leegomery Borough Councillors - Cllr Eileen Callear, Cllr Amrik Jhawar and Cllr Julie Kaur have been working on a number of projects recently, including work to the Hurleybrook Path, and replacement benches near the Locks at the back of Warwick Way. They had a meeting with the Rights of

Way Officer from Telford & Wrekin and have requested repairs under the railway bridge on Hadley Road (that links through to Ketley, the railway bridge near the Nettlefolds that links through to Sankey Drive and also next to the shop on Hadley Park Road.

They have attended meetings with the Police and Safer-Stronger team from T&W Council and are working on a number of ideas including more artwork, wellbeing classes at Leegomery Community Centre and an event around the safety of women and girls. Cllr Pride Funding for 24/25 has now been spent on a number of projects including TAARC Community Garden at the back of Summerhouse Drive, War Memorial rejuvenation, benches, Signage at Leegomery Pools, an event by Kushdil, cleaning of paths, The Big Christmas Give by Homestart, Santas Sleigh with T&W Interfaith, Forgetme-not club, Hurleybrook Path improvements, LCT Food Hubs, Wellington Boxing Academy and more. Hadley Park Road crossings are now ready to be installed. This is just a small selection of the work that is being done!
